

The Days Of Sukkah Building

We have all just experienced the Lord's Day of *Yom Kippur*. We set aside a full day to:

- Refrain from normal labor and work
- Fast
- Pray

We search the depths of our spiritman to reach inwards with the fullest desire to present our understanding of our total potential to God for the coming year. As we move nearer to God's Plan in this annual commitment, we find a rising sense of joy as we realize that God's Mercy is always extended towards us through the Atonement of the Messiah.

We now have four days to "build" the *Sukkah* for the *Feast of Sukkot*. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:46-49 that the physical must precede the spiritual.



As a result, even those who proclaim Y'shua as Messiah, are called to "keep" this Feast. We are rehearsing, in an act of obedience, the "climb" of our spirit-soul from the earthly level to the spiritual revelation of a closer relationship with our Creator, the God of the Universe.

In the physical, the Israelites have moved from Rameses in Egypt to the town of Sukkot.

Exodus 12:37 “37 The Israelites journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about 600,000 men on foot, besides women and children.”

In the spiritual realm, the Israelites moved from slavery to reborn, free men. Their entire mindset of poverty and illegitimacy had to be changed to one of *sonship* by adoption.

How does God do this?

The Torah says that YHWH “lifts us up” on eagles’ wings. It is not something that I can do. I need to prepare my heart and submit to His Will and YHWH will change my focus on ...

Exodus 19:4 “4 You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on **eagles’ wings** and brought you to Myself.”

In other words, by building and entering into the *Sukkah*, I acknowledge my dependency on YHWH, and request Him to remove all limitations and hindrances, and reveal all of my opportunities or possibilities in the year ahead.

Finally, the word “Sukkah” is normally translated as “hut”, but is closely related to the word “Socheh” which means to “*look into the future*”.

Obedience to YHWH’s Commandments, a repentant heart, and the Atonement Sacrifice of Messiah are the ingredients for a revitalized spiritman.

*Do you expect a miracle from YHWH in your life for
this new year?*

If so, go out and live the principle found in ...

Song of Solomon 3:11 “11 Go forth, O you daughters of Zion, and gaze upon King Solomon wearing the crown with which his mother [Bathsheba] crowned him on the day of his wedding, on the day of his gladness of heart.”

This principle symbolizes the joy of the Bride in gazing upon her Bridegroom as they are united on their Wedding Day.
